


This designation recognizes a city or organization's efforts to prepare its staff and citizens to recognize when someone suffers a sudden cardiac arrest and how to respond.

Following up on a commitment which we made three years ago, infrastructure continues to be the buzz word for the Board of Selectmen. Hopefully by the time you read this we will be well on our way to becoming the "Town of Construction". Over the last year we have constructed the new entranceway/parking lot and track/field at the High School, replaced the roofs at the Library/Community Center and the High School and Intermediate School, and began a major road improvement program. We have upgraded the deck and filtration and chemical systems at the Town pool and made improvements to the Transfer Station.

This summer we are helping with the installation of new playgrounds at Cherry Brook School funded by the PTO. We are finalizing the preliminary design for upgrades to Town Bridge funded by a Federal Grant and will be submitting the design to the Feds for approval. While construction is several years away, this is an important step. Using State funding to small towns we will be designing upgrades to the Mills Pond recreational area. The pool house will be upgraded, the tennis and basketball courts resurfaced, the skate park refurbished and a master plan for future improvements developed. The pool house improvements should be in place before next season.

In addition to routine road maintenance this construction season's major projects' will include Case Street, Gracey Road, Indian Hill Road, Powder Mill Road, Thayer Avenue, Andrew Drive and High Valley. East Hill Road which is requiring more design work than anticipated is scheduled for construction for next spring. In addition to the \$6M in bond funding for road improvements approved at Town Referendum, the Town has been able to secure \$1M in funding for work on East Hill between Maple Avenue and Silver Mine Acres.

With the assistance of a State Main Street Grant we will be making improvements to the portion of Main Street between Bridge Street (Route 179) and Front Street to make the area more pedestrian friendly. Future projects will extend this project to River Street and along River Street to Bridge Street.

The Board with the assistance of the Permanent Municipal Building Committee has revised the design for a new Public Works garage on Commerce Drive. Using a "design build" process, the proposal, which is expected to be before the voters at the November election, will have a fixed cost which has been reduced to \$4.8M. Upon voter approval of this proposal, the Town will be able to pursue the recreational upgrades to the area of the old garage adjacent to the Farmington River. This proposal is in the Upper Mill Pond Study which was funded several years ago by a \$100K State Grant.

With the passage of the Federal Collinsville Renewable Energy Act, the Town is preceding through a join municipal/private partnership to reactivate the old Collins Company hydroelectric generating facilities.

All in all, a lot of construction activities are in store for Canton's future. The Board thanks the various Boards and Commissions and town staff that are actively making these projects a reality. To the residents, please observe the "Town at Work" signs and excuse any interruption in services which may occur.

Meet: Steven Byko **Position with the Town:** Interim Recreational Program Supervisor

Background: I grew up in Bristol and went to Bristol Eastern High. Bristol was a great city to grow up in back then, particularly if you loved sports...and I loved playing baseball. It was filled with kids and we played from early in the morning until well after the street lamps came on in the evening. Although not a star player, I was consistent and scrappy enough to earn a walk-on spot with the University of Hartford baseball team and a grant that paid for half of my tuition. Not bad for never having played in high school.

A combination of idealism, youthful exuberance and a sense of duty motivated me to leave college after a year and enlist with the Marines in 1966. After getting out in 1970, I went back to school under the G.I. Bill at the University of Connecticut and received a BS in Real Estate and Urban Economic Studies. Over the next 25 years, I worked in Commercial Real Estate as an appraiser then as a commercial mortgage lender for both Travelers and Aetna, responsible for making real estate loans from \$10mm to approximatel \$200mm. It was at Aetna that I met my wife of 26 years, Kathy



Zamborsky...and one of the best things that has ever happened to me. We have lived all of our life together in Canton and with our two daughters, Amelia and Claire. Over the years we have come to truly love this community and the people within it.

When Aetna decided to become a health care provider instead of an insurance company, the Real Estate Investment Department was generally phased out and I went into business for myself as a consultant. For the next 15 or so years, I worked with investors, developers, real estate appraisers and institutions analyzing commercial real state projects like shopping centers, office buildings, hotels, warehouses and apartment complexes, primarily for national clients in New York and across the country. I have loved analyzing projects and pointing out issues and strengths to my clients.

With the downturn in the economy a number of years ago, many of my clients moved to the sidelines or left the business completely and I found myself doing a variety of things to keep myself busy and keep money coming in. However, I've always worked to do the best job I could regardless of how much money I was paid. In the last 8-9 years I've worked for as little as \$10.00 per hour and at times many multiples over that, but have always given the same level of service regardless of the pay level. I think it comes from my blue-collar parent upbringing. They worked hard to keep us clothed and fed during some pretty lean years when New Departure in Bristol went through its cyclical periods of hiring and laying off workers. I've never forgotten that and to some extent it has defined who I am.

Education: I like to think of my education as a mix of that which I learned as a Marine, that which my parents taught me, and that which I learned earning a degree at the University of Connecticut. The thing I haven't learned very well is not to work too hard. I can't seem to do the minimum.

Best Part of the Job: I haven't been here long, but I love learning new things, which the job has plenty of. I'm fortunate enough to have a good boss in Josh Medeiros, the new Parks & Rec Director, and appreciate his work ethic and the new creative ideas that he is bringing to the department, plus I get to work with some really nice people. The thing I probably like the most is the social contact with the clients, the people of Canton.

In particular, I like the seniors that come in for the various programs, especially the exercise programs. They have an infectious zest for life and give me something to strive for. For example, take Mary Root. She comes in to run one of the senior's exercise programs in some of the wildest costumes, like the

Superman outfit she wore this past week. The people in her class love her and I know she gets a bit more out of them because of what she gives them...100% of herself every session. I think that can be said of a number of the instructors in our programs. They really seem to enjoy what they are doing. I've had some nice comments and thank you's from the people around me, which surprises me at times because this is essentially a service business and if we at Park & Rec or any service business aren't willing to provide good service, what's the point in being here.

Personal: I ended up at Park & Rec because The Cave (Teen Center) needed someone for the weekends to be a sort of chaperone. When Brian Wilson, Director or Park & Rec announced he was going to New Hampshire and Darrien Lynn, the Program Supervisor indicated that she would be moving to Ohio, I was about all that was left of Park & Rec, so I was asked to fill in at least until the end of August. Friday nights, I'm still at The Cave with my young "Cave Men" and "Cave Women". The Cave is their place and I think it's an important place for them to go. Not just because it has a pool table, ping pong table, and free snacks and drinks, but it provides a caring "safe" environment for these young people to go and congregate.

I have a philosophy that I live by with respect to work that I try to pass on to my children and young people that I come in contact with. No matter who you work for, you only really work for yourself, the job you do is "branded" by who you are and what you put into it. If you take a job, work as if it's your own company, it really is. Take pride in everything you do no matter how small or how large the assignment. Learn something from everything you do. If you do your best, that's all that can be expected of you.

Little Know Fact: My wife Kathy and I were married 26 years ago in the back yard of the house we own in Canton. We didn't intend to come out this far, but our broker found a place that we both liked and we were hooked. In the second year we lived here I started coaching Babe Ruth Baseball, with Kathy as my scorekeeper, and really made a lot of friends in the community. A number of the kids have remained friends over the years and we have attended some weddings. One young man called this past year to say thank you for some thing that we did to try and help him out 24 years ago. It gave me a great feeling. Department of Public Works — Notice of Roadway Improvements for Fall, 2014

Canton Residents: The Town of Canton Department of Public Works would like to give you an up-date on roadwork that is currently on going and what is proposed for this fall.

Current Roadwork:



Andrew & High Valley Drive is currently under road construction. The roadway improvements will include drainage enhancements, catch basin repairs, reclamation/milling or reconstruction of the existing bituminous concrete pavement section, resurfacing of the roadway, curb replacement (curbs will be backfilled with top soil and seed), and reconstruction of driveway aprons as required. The roadways will be open to local traffic at all times during construction. Detours signs will be provided during construction activities to reduce traffic congestion during construction. Roadwork should be completed in early fall, weather permitting. The estimated road repair costs for Andrew & High Valley Drive are \$931,665.00

Proposed Roadwork:

Weather and vendor schedule permitting, the following proposed roads are scheduled for repairs this fall. *Denotes roads currently in the engineering stage with roadwork to follow.

Case Street*, Gracey Road*, Indian Hill Road*, Powder Mill Road*, and Thayer Avenue - The roadway improvements will include drainage enhancements, catch basin repairs, reclamation/milling or reconstruction of the existing bituminous concrete pavement section, resurfacing of the roadway, curb replacement (curbs will be backfilled with top soil and seed), and reconstruction of driveway aprons as required. The roadways will be open to local traffic at all times during construction. Detours signs will be provided during construction activities to reduce traffic congestion during construction. The estimated road repair costs for Case Street, Gracey Road, Indian Hill Road, Powder Mill Road, and Thayer Avenue are \$3,252,147.00

Hilltop Drive and Wright Road - The roadway improvements will include minor drainage improvements, thin overlay of the existing bituminous concrete pavement, and reconstruction of driveway aprons as required. The roadways will be open to local traffic at all times during construction. Detours signs will be provided during construction activities to reduce traffic congestion during construction. The estimated road repair costs for Hilltop Drive and Wright Road are \$260,000.00

"Serving the Community with Pride" A Message from the Director of Public Works, Robert Martin



As the person responsible for leading the daily operations in the Department of Public Works (DPW), I would like to speak to you about the relocation of the Public Works Facility. DPW is a major town department that is involved in your lives on a daily basis. Besides snow and ice removal, DPW staff helps maintain and improve upon numerous areas of our town that you may not be aware of. During the warmer months, the staff does road repair and maintenance work, keeps the

trails open and safe. We maintain the parks and athletic facilities by mowing and setting up events, and we take care of the town pool. The staff also works on all the school campuses plowing in the winter, maintaining school grounds and athletic facilities. We also maintain all the town buildings and their grounds. If your child plays sports, we most likely are behind the scenes helping to provide safe well groomed playing fields. We also are involved with assisting community groups. This past summer we worked with the Cherry Brook PTO to build the new Playscape for the students and children of our community.

In conjunction with the Police and Fire Departments, DPW plays a major role in first responding to all types of emergency situations that affect our community. During my four years working for you I have seen firsthand several emergency events that paralyzed our community. DPW was in the forefront making the town safe and restoring our town roads, facilities and homes back to normal. I have seen the hard working staff work two weeks straight to clean up the winter storm in October, 2011, along with several recent blizzard events. We also assist the Fire Department and Police Department by providing support with our trucks and heavy equipment in times of emergency.

On Tuesday, November 4, 2014 when you go to the polls to vote for various political offices, you may also be asked a very important referendum question to allow the town to bond funds to build a new Public Works Facility. As a tax payer I would imagine the first thing that comes to mind is how this new facility impacts you and your family. This new facility will impact your lives in many ways. Like the new Police Department facility built in 2002, this facility will be another essential town facility dedicated to public safety and maintenance that currently is lacking. By replacing the outdated facility on the river we will be able to provide emergency services in winter weather as well as during possible natural disasters.

Services such as having enough treated road salt to fight back to back winter storms. We currently do not have that ability. We will be able to provide gas and fuel to all town departments in the time of emergency for numerous days, we currently only have in the time of emergency the capacity to provide gas and fuel for 3 days. The new facility will allow the DPW, Police, and Water Pollution departments a modern repair facility to maintain the equipment and vehicles.

Currently the town sends out all their repair work paying a premium to maintain this equipment. The new facility will also have a wash bay that will allow the department to clean their equipment and vehicles.

The department is prohibited by DEEP to wash vehicles on the current site due to the close proximity to the river. To understand how this impacts you, itcs really simple. By not being allowed to adequately wash DPWcs \$1,000,000.00 equipment and vehicles it shortens the useful life by a third. For example, instead of getting 15 years of service life out of a piece of equipment we are only getting 10 years. This impacts funds that could be used on other badly needed upgrades and projects throughout our community.

As the DPW facility (s) location would be moved elsewhere, the town-owned land would have a huge potential to enhance the lives of everyone in the community. Due to its close proximity to the water, the opportunity could present itself to create a boat-launch for kayaks, canoes, and other small watercraft, this is currently not available to the community. The area would lend itself nicely to handicapped fishing access as well as provide more parking for the trailhead and events in Collinsville.

The Public Works staff has always been there for the community, our motto is %erving the community with pride+. By working together, as a whole, we can continue to make Canton a great community.

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



Eligible residents should contact the office in August to receive vouchers. Available until they run out. One per person per season.

Food Stamp Program (SNAP)

The Food Stamp Program (now called SNAP) provides monthly cash assistance to help low-income households buy groceries. Eligibility for food stamps is based on household income and assets. 

IF I JOIN THE FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY, WHAT WILL THEY DO WITH MY MONEY?

The Friends of the Canton Public Library is just like the school PTOs. Members raise funds so that the Library can purchase items that its tax-funded operating budget can't be stretched far enough to cover. Also, Friends members speak out in support of the Library at town meetings and in other venues throughout town.

- The Library contribution to producing *Canton Connections*: \$1,000.00

New library cards (2,000): \$1,000.00

In total, Friends' gifts to the Library during FY 2013-14 totaled \$15,000.00. And, at their annual meeting in June, members voted another \$15,000.00 gift to the Library for FY 2014-15. 



Mills Pond Park (East Hill Road)
