Who is Sam Collins?

In 1826, 23 year old Samuel Collins, his brother David, and cousin William acquired the five-acre site of an old sawmill and gristmill on the Farmington River in Canton. Being as axes were the era's most desirable tool, the three men wanted in. The Collins Company developed a high quality line of edged tools and weapons. Over time, Collins equipment made its way all over the world including playing a part in every American conflict from the Civil War to Vietnam. What is known as Collinsville was a settlement created by the Collins Company; they constructed 45 duplexes to house their worker's families. These homes are scattered around Collinsville and are still lived in today. Walking around Collinsville today it is easy to picture the village in its heyday. Now when your full and happy after a day at Sam Collins Day don't forget to stop at the hillside graveyard on Cemetery Road to thank Sam Collins, who was buried there in 1871.

SELECTMEN'S CORNER

The summer may have been short and rainy, but your Town government has been busy. Charter Revision Commission which was appointed in January 2008 has completed a sixteen month process to review our existing Town Charter and have proposed revisions to streamline and improve our Town government. Following months of meetings, public hearings and input from town officials and citizens, the Commission their made recommendation to the Board of Selectmen in August. Those recommendations were unanimously the Board accepted bv Selectmen. The final step will be to present the recommendations for adoption at the November elections. The Board is planning informational meeting to brief voters on the Commission's recommenddations. The revisions are posted on the Town website. 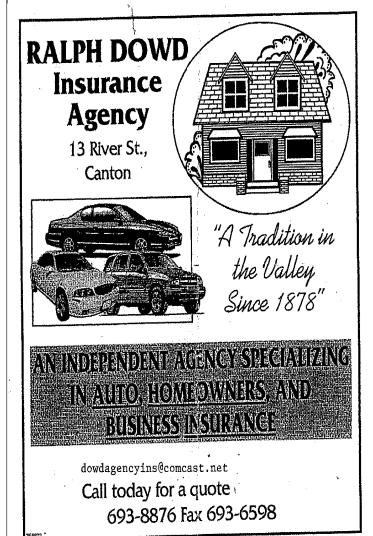

picked up during programs here at the Community & Senior Center.

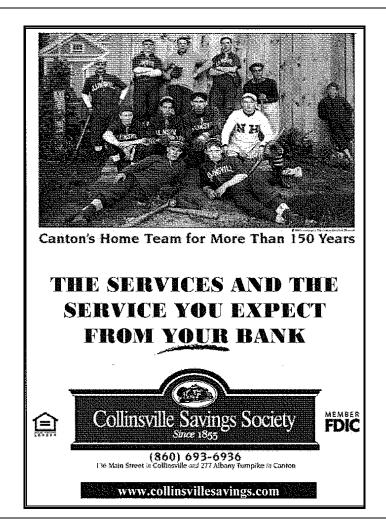

MEET JAY KAPLAN

Volunteer Position in Town: Jay is a member of the Canton Conservation Commission and the Open Space Preservation & Acquisition Commission.

Background: A New York native, Jay came to Canton in 1973, to serve as a naturalist at Roaring Brook Nature Center. Thirty-six years later, he's still here as the Center's Director.

Education: Jay holds a bachelors degree from Cornell University and a masters from The Pennsylvania State University.

Best Part of Volunteering: Over the years, Jay has helped many Canton residents with their concerns about wildlife and other environmental issues. He is particularly proud of his work with a generation of Canton students, with whom he has shared his love of wildlife and the outdoors. Some of his former students have gone on to serve as teachers, veterinarians, and one even became a professional mountain climber.

Personal: Jay is married to Canton native Kate Simmons Kaplan and has two children, Josh and Sarah. His late mother-in-law, Martha Simmons, was well known in Town as the proprietor of The Frame-Up, and was involved in many volunteer activities over the years. Jay has a strong interest in land use and in the natural history of our area and has served on numerous boards and commissions. He is long-time director of the Canton Land Conservation Trust. He has served as a past president of the Hartford Audubon Society and the Connecticut Ornithological Association and remains active in both organizations.

Little Known Fact: Jay offers a summer program for students, perhaps the only such program in Connecticut that focuses on dragonflies. These important insects are environmental indicators that tell us about the health of our environment. "Chasing Dragons" examines the natural history of these fascinating creatures and has provided documentation on rare species both here in Canton and in other areas of Connecticut. He can often be found wandering about Canton at all hours documenting unusual wildlife sightings.



FIRE MARSHAL

Upcoming Winter Safety Tips

- Keep live Christmas trees watered. Dry Christmas trees catch fire easily.
- When hanging holiday lights, make sure you follow the manufacturer's instructions on how many lights are able to be strung together. Ensure the lights have been tested by a listing company, such as Underwriters Laboratories.
- Have your chimney, wood stove and fire place inspected and cleaned. Chimneys can build up creosote causing a blockage in the flue. A blockage may lead to poor ventilation and possible carbon monoxide poisoning in the home. Creosote buildup may also catch fire when heated, causing a chimney fire that could extend to the rest of the house.
- Have your furnace or boiler inspected yearly.
- Install smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors on each level of the house, ensuring one of each is located near each bedroom area.
- Do not run extension cords under rugs or carpets.
 Extension cords may overheat and subsequently cause a fire.
- Do not run your cars inside an attached garage for an extended period of time (i.e. to warm it up).
 Carbon monoxide, odorless and colorless, will build up and collect in the house. Remember that carbon monoxide is the "silent killer".
- Make sure that fireplace or wood stove ashes are disposed of properly. Do not put hot coals in a wastebasket until cooled. A good practice is placing hot coals in a metal container outside and away from any structure.

Election Day is Tuesday, November 3rd! Positions for First Selectman, Selectmen, Board of Finance, Board of Education, Board of Assessment Appeals, and Constables will be decided. In addition, there will be a question on the ballot regarding the approval of the Town Charter as revised for January 2010. You will have ample opportunity and time to review the final draft of this document before casting your vote. Updates are posted on the main page of the website at www.townofcantonct.org. All voting occurs at Town Hall, 4 Market Street, Collinsville, from 6am-8pm. Call Town Clerk, Linda Smith, with questions about registration or absentee ballots.

The last day to **register to vote** *by mail* in order to participate in November's election is October 20^{th.} (The envelope must be postmarked by October 20th). You have until October 27th if you deliver *in person* your registration card to the Registrar of Voters. Registration forms can be obtained from a download on www.townofcantonct.org. Scroll down to 'Voting Information and Election Results' and click on the link to the Secretary of the State's office. Mail that form to: Canton Registrar of Voters, PO Box 168, Collinsville, CT 06022.

<u>Transfer Station Stickers</u> for 2010 will be available beginning Election Day, November 3rd. All residents MUST present a copy of their vehicle's REGISTRATION for each car in need of a sticker. The permit sticker fee is \$100 for the first car and \$1 for the second vehicle in the household. After Election Day, you may purchase the annual permit from the Town Clerk's office during regular business hours.

The Canton Public Library now owns 3 online information databases. "Learning Express Library" offers a range of interactive skill-building courses and instantly-scored practice tests, including over 700 practice exams for students and adults, plus a "Job & Career Help Center." Our new "Hartford Courant Historical Database" gives you access to articles that appeared in the Courant from 1923 to1984. These are the years not covered by the State Library databases. "JobNow!" is a resource that will help people review their resumes and cover letters and practice interviewing, all online. In addition to live, interactive online help, a variety of resources will guide patrons through the necessary tasks toward getting a job. All 3 of these databases are (1) gifts of the Friends of the Library, (2) accessible from the library computers AND your personal computers, and (3) entered via our website (click on the link marked "Electronic Resources"). You must be a Canton library cardholder to use these databases. These databases supplement those available from the Connecticut State Library at www.iconn.org.

Look who is checking US out!

Check-outs of books and audiovisual items for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2009 totaled 184,152. For the fiscal



year ended June 30, 2008, the total was 168,644. That's a 9.2% increase. Who says books and reading are dead? (PS: We answered 21,062 information questions and our patron-access computers were used 19,891 times.)

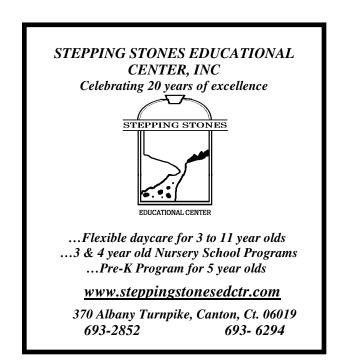

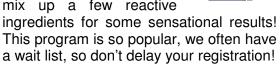
